

Golf day in memory of a good friend

A **GOLF** match was held in memory of a young man from Bookham who died of a brain tumour.

The first Peter Culverhouse Memorial Trust golf day was held on what would have been his 32nd birthday on Wednesday June 9 at Clandon Regis Golf Club.

The trust was set up last October by four of Peter's friends after he lost his seven-year battle against a tumour.

All money raised goes towards Princess Alice Hospice at Esber, which cared for Peter during his last five weeks.

The game, which was

enthusiastically supported by friends and family, featured 44 golfers competing in 11 teams of four.

The winning team of captain Bryan Duffy, Andy Croskell, Richard Bragg and Jim Radford was presented with a trophy and individual prizes by Derek Wreay, from the Wreay Partnership.

There were also awards for runners-up, the longest drive, and nearest to the pin, as well as for the most lost balls.

In the evening, 86 guests attended a four-course dinner held in the golf club restaurant and more than £550 was raised

in the raffle.

Among some of the top prizes on offer at the auction which followed were a box at the Royal Albert Hall for a Saturday night at the Proms donated by the Legal and General, a long weekend in Paris, travelling by Eurostar to the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp in October, gifted by Bowood Leisure, as well as an autographed authenticated photograph of David Beckham, donated by auctioneer Bob Green's family.

The raffle and auction, together with other donations raised about £2,500 for the trust.
